DETAILED MAPPING OF UNDP'S REGIONAL ASSETS AND CAPACITIES IN RESPONSE TO EXECUTIVE BOARD DECISION 2019/15

26 August 2019

- 1. The mapping of UNDP's regional assets and capacities responds to Executive Board decision 2019/15 in which the Board requested UNDP to "provide, for information at the next session of the Executive Board, a detailed mapping of their regional assets and capacities, [...]". To facilitate Executive Board members' understanding of UNDP's assets and capacities at regional level, the table below should be read with the following parameters in mind:
- The table provides an <u>up-to-date overview</u> of UNDP's assets and capacities at regional level, providing the latest staffing figures as of August 2019, regional programme core allocations for the current year and estimates of regional programme non-core expenditures as per the latest 2019 projections.
- It provides a <u>comprehensive</u> overview of assets and capacities clustered in UNDP's five regional hubs in Addis Ababa (including sub-regional assets in Dakar and Nairobi), Amman, Bangkok, Istanbul and Panama City.
- It maps two types of assets located in UNDP's regional hubs, namely (a) <u>country-facing</u> staff who support the implementation of UNDP's country programmes, and (b) <u>region-facing</u> staff who support the implementation of UNDP's regional (cross-border) programmes.
- It is important to note that UNDP's country-facing staff in the regional hubs include staff with <u>cross-regional</u> programme, policy and partnership functions (see staff category 2 in the table). These are mostly staff who belong to the newly established Global Policy Network and, as part of this network, support country offices across <u>all</u> regions based on their area of expertise, irrespective of their region-specific location.
- The table distinguishes between <u>core and non-core</u> regional programme funded staff and related expenditures to show the proportion of regional programme resources that is earmarked to specific programmes and projects (staff category 5).
- It provides <u>explanatory endnotes</u>, where specific data needs to be contextualized for a more nuanced understanding.
